Students' grievances are collected in bullk or individual, Issues are discussed in the students' Grievances Redressal Cell and possible solutions of grievances raised by the students are communicated to the students.

#### Student Health-

Maintaining good health related programmes are organized by the college to help student teacher to cope with the comprehensive programme schedule. The college organizes medical check up programme for all the students twice in a session and in emergency on call doctor facility is provided.

#### Felicitation of students-

The students showing the outstanding performance in academics or co-curricular activities are felicitated and cash prize also provided.

#### Scientific temper among students-

Students are keep informed and motivated for to participate in science exhibition, summer school programmes, different university/state level event based on scientific temper.

#### **Providing Guidance and Counseling Services-**

All kind of guidance services are provided to students by organizing the short term programme like CRT, personality development, Motivational talk, talk on employments etc. The college organizes the workshops, seminars and personal contact programmes for the students.

#### INTERACTIVE WHITE BOARD USAGE & ICT FORTIFIED PEDAGOGY

Goal:

Enhancing faculty competencies with the use of interactive white board and ICT for effective teaching and learning.

The Context:

Use of ICT in teaching learning process has been considered as the innovative best method for upgrading the teaching and learning process in the HEIs. It is not only exciting and permanent but also promotes the teaching capabilities of the teachers as the facilitators of learning. It enhances self-learning and helps the students to acquire knowledge at their own. It prepares the slow as well as advance learners for perspective studies.

The practice:

The apex authorities and the stakeholders have always looked for the innovative teaching and learning rather than traditional ones. In this quest, every class room is equipped with white interactive board and CAD tools. The faculty members are requested to adopt use of audio visual aids. At this end the teachers informed to teach with the help of slides, transparency, power point presentation and then interactive board. The teachers are trained to use the boards by taking numbers of training classes by the experts and the teachers who are expert in handling the ICT enabled system. Further, moving toward the self-learning, the students are encouraged to prepare slides, PPTs as a part of assignment. This makes the teaching-learning process as two way process which involve teachers and students. Monitory mechanism for the use interactive board is practiced. The faculty was informed to use fully ICT enabled teaching method. For assistance an expert from faculty was deployed.

As a result, the faculty became skilled to acquaint ICT enabled class room.

Evidences of Success:

Teachers have developed e-content like PPT, SOL, Simulation based study material, examination oriented notes, multimedia etc. All teachers use ICT enabled technique. Students are encouraged to expose themselves before teachers and stakeholders.
